HOW TO CHOOSE ONE'S LULAV

by Torah-Box!

Every day of the holiday of Sukkot (except on Shabbat), we have the Mitzvah to take "the Four Species": a Lulav (a date palm branch), an Etrog (a lemon), three Hadassim (myrtle branches), and two Aravot (willow branches).

When you purchase them, bring this sheet created by the Torah-Box team along with you. In order for your Mitzvah to be valid, the four species must respect a few basic rules.

	ETROG			
	Color	Preferably yellow. If not, green.		
	Skin	Without any holes, nor parts of missing skin or flesh.		
		Preferably yellow. If not, green.		
	Upper part	Must not contain black holes on the upper and lower tip		
	Shape	Pyramid: large on its lower part and thinner		
4		on its upper part.		
	Tip If it has a tip (Pitom), it must not be broken.			

LULAV		
Central branch	The central branch of the tip cannot be split into two parts. It must be closed.	
Tip	Whole and unbroken.	
Freshness	Not dried out.	
Shape	Minimal length: 40 cm (or 15.75 inches)	
Tip	The straightest shape possible.	

HADASS		
Branches	3 branches.	
Leaves	Must have grown on the same spot on the branch, by groups of 3, on half of the length.	
Freshness	Not dried out (cannot erode itself).	
Size	Minimal length: 24 cm (or 9.44 inches) Preferably 30 cm (or 11.81 inches)	

	ARAVA		
Branches	2 small twigs.		
Leaf shape	Elongated (and not round).		
Leaf outline	Smooth (and not in "saw teeth").		
Size	Minimal length: 24 cm(or 9.44 inche) Preferably 30 cm (or 11.81 inches)		

Make sure that the "4 species" are under rabbinal control.
